# **Results From the Survey 2024**


**We had 29 Responses!** A big thank you to everyone that has taken part, your feedback is very much appreciated and will help us make OLGBT even better.

This survey and other feedback obtained from our members will help the board develop plans for the next two years which will include a fabulous programme of meetings, events and activities to celebrate our fifteenth year anniversary. As we get bigger and better, we need more members to help us make things happen. Please let us know if you are willing to help.

  - Online Social Meetings on Zoom (every Monday when we don't meet in person, 5.30pm on Zoom)




27 out of 29 people said they would be likely to attend a social meeting at Fenton. Almost two thirds (19) said they would attend social meetings at the Summer Street centre and one third (9) were likely to attend a Zoom meeting.

2. We hope to provide a programme of other social activities in addition to our regular social meetings. Which of the following would interest you (tick all that apply)




#### Comments submitted under the other option:

- "Possibly; pubs, clubs, sport/games, restaurants, music, health orientated presentations."
- "Cycling only if gentle like Lyme Valley I know my way around this area it's about 5
  mile and goes from far end of Silverdale to Newcastle Town FC with stops available
  e.g. cafe and toilets in Morrisons or at the café in car park etc."
- "Any group or multi-group activity"
- "Photography workshops, theatre or other events."

The most popular option was trips and outings with 24 out of 28 respondents. The next most popular choice was walking – something we might want to consider offering more of though clearly it will not suit everyone. Drama, dance and digital skills were the least popular options though they all attracted more than a third of our respondents.

3. When are you most likely to attend our meetings and activities? (Please select all the times that suit you)







One person commented - "Not mornings, if a regular scheduled event."

Weekday daytimes suit most people (25) with daytimes at weekends being the next most popular option (19). Evenings on weekdays attract almost half our respondents and we should bear in mind that a few members work or have other daytime commitments.

5. Is there anything you would like to tell us or suggest?


There were 12 responses to this question:


- Keep up the good work

- Q2- Canal Boat Trip Definitely! Q3 Evenings on Weekdays occasionally if bases improve every time Generally all is well, we are catering for many tastes in social outings, theatre etc.



## 7. Do you identify as Trans



### 8. How would you describe your sexual orientation







One other – "Queer and gay"


#### 9. How would you describe your Ethnicity






### 10. What is your age range?






#### 11. Would you describe yourself as having a disability or sensory impairment






We need to give thought to better meeting the needs of people with a disability or sensory impairment.
