Erection and dismantling of a Gazebo	Volunteers (lifting and carrying, injury while erecting or dismantling)	Carry gazebo to pitch in loads of manageable size and weight. Follow good practice for lifting and carrying Follow instructions (or supervision of someone who has erected gazebo before) Minimum of two persons to carry and erect. Follow same procedure to dismantle and remove.	Distribute guidance to volunteers.	Lead organiser	In advance	
Gazebo falls over or is blown over	Volunteers, members of the public	Ensure Gazebo is adequately secured at site. If in doubt about stability do not use. In event of strong winds or other adverse weather that affects safety do not erect gazebo or if already erected dismantle immediately	Distribute guidance to volunteers	Lead organiser	In advance

Bad behaviour such as inappropriate language or breach of confidentiality	Volunteers	Volunteers are well known to us. There is no obvious risk of verbal or physical abuse. Volunteers can seek assistance from Pride organisers and/or police to manage any situations that arise.	Distribute guidance to volunteers. Advise volunteers to work in pairs (no lone working)	Lead organiser	In advance	
Accident or injury	Volunteers	Remind everyone to bring any medication, mobility aids etc that they need. Each attendee is responsible own safety. Keep a record of who to contact in an emergency for each attendee.	Remind everyone in advance, take a register of volunteers with contact details Distribute guidance to volunteers.	Lead organiser	In advance	
Weather - injury from sunburn or excessive wet or cold	Members and Volunteers	Remind everyone to check the weather forecast and dress appropriately. Bring extra clothes for eventuality of bad weather if needed. Bring hat and/or sun cream if it is a sunny day	Distribute guidance to volunteers.	Lead organiser	In advance	
Carrying a banner	Volunteers and members of the public	Volunteers to have strength and fitness required. For long parades two pairs for each banner to take turns. Take care with poles. Do not raise or lower in close proximity to others who could be injured. Do not carry in windy or other adverse weather.	Distribute guidance to volunteers.	Lead organiser	In advance

The wearing of face masks is now a personal choice in line with Government Guidance Any volunteer with symptoms of Covid or ill health should not attend.	Distribute guidance to volunteers. Take spare hand sanitiser.	Lead organiser	In advance
